Information about Scholarships

Recipients are selected by the UW-Barron County Scholarship Committee. Half of the total scholarship award amount is paid at the beginning of each semester in the academic year. Please note that "financial need" is determined by EFC score on FAFSA.

Rice Lake Rotary Club Scholarship (1 - \$1,000)

3.3 minimum cumulative GPA. Area high school student. Must rank in top third of class, show solid academic preparation and participate in school activities and/or receive special recognition.

Gladys Miller Scholarship (1 - \$1,000)

3.3 minimum cumulative GPA. Must show solid academic preparation and have participated in extracurricular activities.

Don Henrich & Bruce Gabriel Memorial Scholarship (1 - \$1,000)

Full-time first-year or continuing student who is active in the community and/or school activities and demonstrates financial need. 3.0+ GPA is desired, but can be overlooked if effort is evident and other criteria are met. Established by the late Don Henrich, friend of UW-BC.

Rice Lake Utilities Scholarship (2 - \$1000)

Full-time first-year or continuing student in good academic standing. Must reside in Rice Lake Utilities' service area. Academic achievement and extra-curricular/community service may be considered.

John "Blackie" & Dolores O'Brien Memorial Scholarship (2 - \$500)

Full-time first-year or continuing student who has participated in athletics or extra-curricular activities and is pursuing a degree in English, Physical Education or Education. Cumulative GPA of 2.5+; demonstrates financial need. This scholarship was created in memory of "Blackie" O'Brien, former UW-BC Phy Ed instructor and coach and Dolores O'Brien, former English teacher.

Katherine (Chick) Stauffer Scholarship (1 - \$500)

Preference given to a first-year student pursuing science, math or social sciences; ranks in the top third of his or her graduating class; shows solid academic preparation and participation in school activities; and has earned a minimum 3.0 overall GPA. Established by the late Chick Stauffer, friend of UW-Barron County, community philanthropist, and widow of the late UW-BC Professor James Stauffer.

Dairy State Bank Scholarship (1 - \$500)

Incoming student from Northwest Wisconsin who demonstrates school or community leadership and dedication to succeed.

Johnson Bank Scholarship (1 - \$500)

Incoming student from Northwest Wisconsin who demonstrates school or community leadership and dedication to succeed.



US Bank Foundation Scholarship (3 - \$500)

Incoming or continuing student from Northwest Wisconsin who demonstrates school or community leadership and dedication to succeed.

Community Partnership Scholarships (2 - \$500)

Full-time incoming students with preference to those with a strong history of community involvement. Community Partnership Scholarships are funded by various community members including V&S Construction, Chronotype, Mary Ocweija & William Smith, Carolyn West and others.

Russell & Karen Rindsig Scholarship (1 - \$500)

First-year or continuing student in good academic standing with evidence of extra-curricular/community service. Preference given to student pursuing a career or with a background in Agriculture or Family & Consumer Sciences. Sponsored by Russell & Karen Rindsig, friends of UW-BC.

UW-Barron County Faculty Diversity Scholarship (1 - \$500)

Full-time new or continuing student. In a brief essay, please explain how you believe you qualify for a 'diversity' scholarship. Financial need will be taken into consideration when awarding this scholarship. Sponsored by UW-BC Faculty.

Kasper Family Political Science & Law Scholarship (1 - \$350)

First-year or continuing student currently enrolled in or having successfully completed at least one political science course with plans to pursue a bachelor's degree in Political Science, Legal Studies, Pre-Law, or Criminal Justice within the UW System. Academic success will be considered. Sponsored by the Eric Kasper family.

Mike Stoll Memorial Scholarship (1 - \$300)

A freshman or continuing student who is a graduate of Rice Lake High School with average to good academic record. School and/or community involvement preferred. Financial need is also a criteria. Sponsored by the family of the late Mike Stoll, UW-BC alumnus.

Arnold "Skip" Widdes Scholarship (1 - \$250)

Freshman demonstrating financial need. Named for former UW-BC Foundation board member, entrepreneur and education supporter Skip Widdes.

Bill Appleyard Memorial Scholarship (1 - \$250)

Full-time incoming or continuing student who is active or former military or the dependent of an active or former military member. Sponsored by the family of Bill Appleyard, driving force behind the Rice Lake Veterans Memorial, and the Rice Lake Chamber of Commerce.

SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS

Karl and Judith Schmid Scholarship (1 - up to \$800)

First-year or continuing student majoring in mathematics, natural science, or engineering (with preference given to mathematics). Must have completed beginning calculus course (MAT 221 or equivalent) with a minimum grade of B- or have completed the Advanced Placement Calculus AB exam with a minimum score of 3. Established by Professor Emeritus Karl Schmid and his wife Judith for whom this scholarship is named.

FINE ARTS

Frank McGinnis Scholarship (2 - \$1,000)

First-year or continuing student majoring in the fine arts (theatre, music, or art) with preference given to art majors.

Addington Music Scholarship (1 - \$400)

Full-time, first-year or continuing student enrolled in at least one performing music class and who is pursuing a major in music therapy, music instruction or general education. Sponsored former educator Carol Addington in memory of her late husband Bill Addington, music enthusiast, friend of UW-BC and former Foundation member.
